# Minimal Systems of Interrogative Words

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
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Wer, wie, was?

### Typology of form

- unanalyzable morpheme (how, but also who)
- diachronically analyzable (why, weshalb)
- analyzable but nonsense semantically (wofür)
- partly analyzable ('raspberry'-type)
- transparantly derived from another questionword (*how much*)
- identical to another questionword (how long? vs. how did you do it?)

## Major paths for derivation




### Sranan (Creole, Surinam)




#### Asheninca (Arawak, Peru)

#### Conclusions

- Synchronically, transparency is ubiquitous
- Diachronically, there is a high 'turn-over rate'
- Extreme transparency is rare
- Extreme ambiguity does not seem to exist
- Ambiguities among major categories are rare
- Ambiguity who = what is relatively common
